How big is the team that this role will manage? Who is in the team?

The role will manage one Programme Manager and two junior designers in the current team. There are also two researchers and a communications manager who will spend time on projects in this area. Additional resources will be contingent on fundraising for the 2019-20 financial year.

What is the budget for this area of work? What is the research budget?

This is still to be confirmed, and dependent on fundraising, but we would estimate a budget of around $\pounds150k$ of external spending would be achievable for the year.
